


* NOTE: TOPAZ Sail Numbers are derived from digital 8 numbers from which any number from 0-9 can be obtained. Ten digital 8 numbers are supplied.



UNO SAIL NUMBERS

If you are applying the self-adhesive numbers to the sail you should do this before you sail your boat for the first time. The sail numbers are exclusive to the boat and correspond with the serial number/ sail number plate. Follow these instructions carefully - it is not a job to be hurried.

1:1 Lay the sail out on a large flat, clean surface with the luff sleeve to your left and the leech to your right. With a soft pencil draw a line 2.5metres from the top of the sail at right angles to the leech of the sail. This is the base line for numbers on this side (the PORT) of the sail. The ISAF Rules specify that the numbers shall be at different heights on the two sides of the sail - those on the port side being the lower.

1:2 Starting on the port side. Draw another pencil line parallel to the leech of the sail, 200mm in from the edge. This marks the right hand edge of the last digit of your sail number and you should apply this first.

1:3 Carefully peel away about one centimetre of the backing paper from the foot of the number and press the exposed portion down on to the pencilled base line. Work upwards, carefully pressing down the number while peeling away the backing paper making sure there are no bubbles or wrinkles. Finally, rub the number down very hard all over.

Carry on with the other digits leaving a minimum 30mm space between each.

1:4 When you have completed the full number on the port side, turn the sail over and draw another pencil line parallel to the top of the port side row of numbers and 150mm above it.

1:5 Starting again 200mm in from the leech - and working from left to right, apply the starboard numbers as before.

1:6 To permanently fuse the numbers on to the sailcloth, gently iron on the reverse side of the numbers with a warm iron. Do not use an iron directly on the numbers.
